HARVEY FIELD NOISE ABATEMENT UPDATE

The Noise Management Committee has developed a Noise Management Program Manual for use by Harvey Field staff and management, pilots, and community members. The written Noise Abatement Procedure formalizes and augments those procedures established in 1978 when airport management originally contacted the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for guidance in establishing a noise abatement procedure. Critical to the success of any noise abatement program is to “get the word out” as effectively as possible to pilots that utilize the services of the airport. The official FAA

Airport Facility Directory as well as a number of pilot organization newsletters will provide this information dissemination channel augmented by on-airport signage, pilot training, and flight review as well as
